Following junior appointments there and a Travelling Fellowship to the USA, he returned to a Consultant Surgical appointment at the Royal Marsden. While there he was awarded a Hunterian Professorship. In retirement he worked at The London Clinic and King Edward VII. He was Vice-President of the RSM. Apart from clinical books he has written extensively on the History of Medicine.

Sir Thomas Browne was a 17th century polymath, physician, philosopher, botanist and writer who lived and practised in Norwich.
